## First Sunday of Advent Cycle A

The Gospel reading today shows us that Jesus knew that humanity does not change. In Noah's time, people continued on with their lives and they did not notice that the flood, which was the end for them, was on the way. Today many people continue to live this way without noticing that some day their own lives will end.

As we know, the forces of evil are powerful and they are well organized. Satan roams about the world like a roaring lion. Human beings and even governments refuse to recognize Christ as their King. Even more, in many countries they openly challenge him, rooting out and killing his faithful. All of this was expected.

Our Lord already warned us that these things would happen. He also knows that Satan tries to find any small crack through which he can infiltrate our lives. But while we continue with our efforts and our prayers to extend the kingdom of Christ throughout the world, we should not fear because the final victory will be Jesus Christ's. He will return gloriously and triumphantly and Satan and his followers will be vanquished forever. Those who strive to live a good life and, through the sacraments, follow Our Lord, Jesus Christ, will also share in his eternal victory.

We should think a lot about these things. Because sooner or later when we encounter Our Lord Jesus Christ face to face moments after our own death, we will have our personal judgment. And when our death arrives it will not be like a trial where we will be able to defend ourselves or explain how we lived so that afterwards we can hear the Lord pronounce the sentence. What will happen is that according to how we lived our lives the Lord will hand down our sentence.

But if this is the particular judgment, what will the last judgment be like? Well, the last judgment will not change the decision that the Lord made when we died. The decision that the Lord made at the moment of our death will not change in the last judgment. Those condemned to hell will continue there and those who have already been saved will stay in heaven. Only those who are in purgatory will be freed so they can enter into the presence of the Lord in heaven. At the last judgment, Christ will announce to everyone who has been saved and who has been condemned.

Brothers and Sisters in Christ, our preparation for the end of the world and the second coming of Christ should begin now and it should be positive. While we are still on earth, there is time to change our lives. Saint Paul tells us that we have time to go from the darkness of sin to the life of a new life in Christ.

### **St. Mary's Elementary**

Preschool and Prekindergarten have thanked God for His many blessings and are continuing their study of letters.
